Member of Burgess 1692-96. Justice. Took oath of allegiance 10/20/1696. Appointed by Gov. Gooch with others to set up Caroline Co., Va. He was a tobacco inspector at Prospect Hill. John settled in Rappahannock (later Essex) Co., Va., where he was granted 560 acres from the Crown as a homesteader on the Rappahannocock, 2 miles below Snow Creek, St. Mary's Parish. Five years later, in 1698, he was granted 750 acres adjacent to the first grant. Elizabeth married Col. William Woodford in 1708 as her second husband. William died ca. 1755. Issue of Elizabeth and John Battaile:
  - (A) John Battaile Born 12/1695, died 3/2/1732-33 in Caroline Co., Va. Justice 1728. Married Sarah Taliaferro (first cousin) who was born 10/16/1695 and died 8/7/1768. Sarah was daughter of John Taliaferro and Sarah (Smith) Taliaferro. Sarah (Taliaferro) Battaile administered her husband's estate.

In 1726 he married (1) Mary, daughter of Col. Francis Thornton. He married (2) Hannah, daughter of James and Martha (Thompson) Taylor. Hannah was sister of Zachary Taylor, grandfather of the President of U.S. Nicholas and John Champe administered the estate of their stepfather, William Woodford, in 1755. Issue:
    - (a) Hay Battaile William Woodford II was his guardian in 1767. This probably the Hay Battaile who live "Hayfield", Caroline Co., Va. Married Mary Champe (she died 1792) and moved to Ky. 1819.

#### WHITE

The Whites were granted land in the Colonies by Robert Beverly because of the fact they were hard workers and because they opposed the Colony's old ruling clique and feudalistic economy. All Whites of Virginia are said to be descended from the emigrant William White from Wiltshire, England, but well nigh impossible to separate.

- WILLIAM WHITE Minister from Wiltshire, England. Lived York and Lancaster Co., Va. Will Lancaster Co., Va., dated 1/25/1658 and proved 2/12/1658. William's brother, Rev. Jeremiah White, was appointed guardian of William's children. There was another brother, John White, vicar of Cheriton als Cheriton, Wiltshire, Eng., who left a legacy to William's children in his will dated 2/1668 and proved 2/6/1671-2. On 5/19/1657, William White married Martha, widow of Major Thomas Brice, Justice of Lancaster Co., Va., 1652 and who left will dated 4/24/1657 and proved 5/19/1657. (Note: This will proved the same date as his widow, Martha, married William White). Martha White left will dated 9/14/1657 and proved 1/24/1658 in which she mentioned her husband's two children, Mary and Jeremiah White of London, Eng. Martha was not the mother of William's children. Children of William White:
  - 1. John White. ) One of these sons of William White was father
  - 2. William White. ) to John White (married Mary Elliot).
  - 3. Edward White. ) Possibly Jeremiah (London) was father also.
  - 4. Deborah White.
  - 5. Mary White Lived London, Eng., at time of father's death.
  - 6. Jeremiah White Lived London at time of father's death.
- II (NAME UNKNOWN) WHITE One of the above sons of William White. Issue (Probably others): (SEE III)

Thomas, James and John White, Jr., were probably sons: probably there were other children. Issue: (SEE IV)
- DANIEL WHITE Lived Orange Co., Va., and left will Culpepper Co., Va., dated 11/23/1788 and proved 12/20/1790. Wife not mentioned in will: evidently deceased. Daniel on record of public service claims, Culpepper Co., Va., 3/20/1782 as furnishing beef to Revolutionary Forces. Issue:
  - 1. Henry White Lived Buckingham Co., Va., 1787. Lived Bedford Co., Va., 1800 with son, Jacob. Will 8/18/1800 and proved 9/27/1802, Bedford Co., Va.
  - John White had daughter Polly.
  - Tabitha White Married a Rogers.
  - 4. FRANCES WHITE Married Battaile Harrison, son of Andrew and Elizabeth (Battaile) Harrison. Battaile Harrison left will dated 12/3/1775 and proved 10/7/1776, Amherst Co., Va. Frances died ca. 1789, Amherst Co., Va. (SEE PAGE 19 OF A HOUSE OF HARRISON FOR THIS LINE.)

#### LEIGH-LEA-LEE

Due to the destruction of records in 1865 of the Va. Counties involved, this Lee line cannot be fully documented.

That William Lea of Amelia Co., Va., was grandson of Col. William Leigh is not in question. Col. William Leigh left two sons: John and William Leigh. Both sons of Col. William Leigh left sons named William; one died Amelia Co., Va., and the other Caswell Co., N.C. Which of these sons named William was son of John Leigh and which was son of William Leigh is the question.

A knowledge of the formation of some Counties is helpful: King and Queen from New Kent 1691. King William from King and Queen 1701-2. Spotsylvania from King and Queen, King William and Essex Cos. 1720-1. Orange from Spotsylvania 1734. (These Cos. all in Va.) Caswell, N.C. from Orange, N.C. 1777. The people involved could remain in the same place but boundries of the Counties change. All land patented by Col. William Leigh (1682-1699) was in St. Stephens Parish, King and Queen Co., Va., except a large grant in Essex Co., Va.

After the death of Col. William Leigh, son John Leigh (according to Quit Rent Rolls of Va. 1704), inherited the bulk of land patented by his father. Provisions seem to have been made for purchase of other lands for the widow, Mary, and the remaining children. Son John Leigh, born New Kent Co., Va., lived King and Queen and Spotsylvania Cos., Va. William Lea of Amelia Co., Va., bought land in Spotsylvania Co., Va., 1743 and was referred to as William Lea of Drysdale Parish, King and Queen Co., Va. When William Lea of Amelia Co., Va., and wife, Rachel, bought land in Amelia Co., Va., 1750, he was again referred to as William Lea of Drysdale Parish, King and Queen Co., Va. This puts him in territory formerly owned by John Leigh.

The other son of Col. William Leigh, William Leigh, was referred to as "of King William Co." The William Lea who died Caswell Co., N.C. (cousin to William Lea of Amelia Co., Va.) lived King and Queen and Spotsylvania Cos., Va., until 1714. The next record of him is with wife, Anne, as witness in Louisa Co., Va., 1746. In 1751-4 this William Lea is selling off land in Orange Co., Va., and is referred to as "from Richmond Co., Va." This would point to his being the son of William Leigh whose inheritance from Col. William Leigh was in form of purchase of "other lands" rather than in form of land patented by Col. William Leigh. This William Lea (referred to as "from Richmond Co., Va.") lived on the border of Louisa and Orange Cos., Va. His brother, Francis Lea, lived life in Louisa Co., Va.

All this does not prove that William Lea of Amelia Co., Va., was son of John Leigh but does point in that direction. There does exist the possibility William Lea of Amelia Co., Va., was son of William Leigh "of King William Co., Va."

The only statement to be made with certainty is that William Lea of Amelia Co., Va., was a descendant of Col. William Leigh with wife, Mary.

- Ι WILLIAM LEIGH - (Col.) Patented land 8/1642 on north side of Charles River (later York River) for transportation of self along with wife, Mary, and daughter, Mary, and 17 other persons. He died 5/1703, King and Queen Co., Va. There were two earlier William Leighs in Va. One settled Charles City Co., Va., 1608 and died ca. 1653 James City Co., Va.; another was William Leigh who was in Surry Co., Va., 1647 and later bought land in Charles City Co., Va. Whether these two William Leighs were related to Col. William Leigh is unknown. Col. William Leigh was in a lawsuit York Co., Va., 1677-8. Granted and bought land 1682-1692 in St. Stephens Parish, King and Queen Co., Va. (formerly New Kent Co. and later part of Spotsylvania Co., Va.) Bought large tract Essex Co., Va., before 1704. Burgess New Kent Co., Va., 1691, Burgess King and Queen Co., Va., 1692, 1693, 1696, 1700, 1702-3. First Judge of Admiralty Court of Va., 1702. Member Council of Va., 1699. Capt. Militia Troop of King and Queen Co., Va., 1698, Comm. Chief of Militia of King and Queen Co., Va., 1699, 1701-2. Chairman of Comm. for Propositions and Grievances of Va. House in 1702. In 1700 Capt. John Waller removed from job of Sheriff of King and Queen Co., Va., for "discovering" that Col. William Leigh had overreached upon the County several thousand pounds of tobacco. Col. William Leigh was then a great favorite with the Governor. A letter from Benjamin Harrison to Phillip Ludwell, dated 5/28/1703.. "Col. Leigh fell 'Tis said he was from his horse lately and cracked his skull and is dead. drunk at Parson Bookers on the Sabbath Day, and going home happn'd to the accident". Issue (There were possibly other daughters):
  - 1. Mary Leigh Born ca. 1642.
  - William Leigh Born after 1642, probably New Kent Co., Va. Known through land deeds as "of King William Co., Va." Possibly married Frances Majors. Died Caswell Co., N. C., before 3/1784 when his son, James Lea of Caswell Co., N. C., entered court for clear title to his share (1/4 of the parcel of land; William Leigh had four sons) of land in King and Queen Co., Va., purchased by his father, James, in his suit, calls himself "son and heir" of William Leigh, deceased. Issue (Probably also daughters):
    - (A) James Lea To Caswell Co., N. C.
    - (B) William Lea Lived King and Queen and Spotsylvania Co., Va., until 1714. The next record of this William is in Louisa Co., Va., when he and wife, Anne, were witnesses. He lived on the border between Louisa and Orange Cos., Va. In records of Orange Co., Va., this William is stated to be "from Richmond Co., Va." William was selling off land in Orange Co., Va., 1751-54. William was Justice Orange Co., N.C., Court 1757, 1760-61. Anne may have been a first wife or else her name may have been Mary Anne because a Mary Lea, wife of William Lea, left will Caswell Co. (formed from Orange Co., N.C., 1777) in 1784.
    - (C) Francis Lea Lived entire life in Louisa Co., Va.
    - (D) John Lea To Caswell Co., N. C.

- II 3. JOHN LEIGH - Born after 1642, probably New Kent Co., Va. Of age 1724 when he was witness to deed in Spotsylvania Co., Va. Prior to this, he patented land in St. John's Parish, King William Co., Va. Granted land Hanover Co., Va., 1725. Sheriff and Justice of Peace in King and Queen Co., Va., 1726. John inherited the bulk of Col. William Leigh's land. John Leigh died ca. 1727-29 in King and Queen Co., Va., as his widow, Ann, had remarried to Thomas Crethers and was herself deceased by 1731. At that time, Thomas Crethers was chosen as guardian by William and Betty Lea, orphans of John Leigh. Thomas Crethers removed the estate of Ann from King and Queen Co., Va., to Spotsylvania Co., Va., 1731. William Lea, orphan of John Leigh, then chose Zachary Taylor as his guardian Oct. 1731. Ann's last name may have been Taylor. The land of James Taylor (wife Mary Gregory) adjoined the Leigh land and the Taylors did have twin daughters, Ann and Elizabeth (born 1685). The location, time and the naming of John and Ann Leigh's children all point to this Taylor connection but this is not proved. Issue: (Perhaps there were other daughters):
  - (Λ) John Lea Thought to be an older son. Of age 1731 as he did not require a guardian upon the death of his parents. Also a signatory to a deed 1732, King and Queen Co., Va. Married Anne, daughter of George and Elizabeth Carter of Spotsylvania Co., Va. Removed to Orange Co., N.C. (later became Caswell Co., N.C.) and was Sheriff there 1770. Will Caswell Co., N.C., 1778. Anne predeceased John. Issue: William, John, Elliott, Carter, Owen, Phebe, Betty and Millie.
  - (B) Catherine Lea Born ca. 1702. She would seem to be an older daughter of John and Ann Leigh. Married (1) George Priddy and (2) Richard Shackelford of King and Queen Co., Va. In 1731 Richard Shackelford and his wife, Catherine, and George Priddy, deceased, instituted a replacement of a former attachment (in Spotsylvania Co., Va.) against Thomas Crethers to give accounting of estate of John Leigh, deceased.
  - (C) Elizabeth (Betty) Lea Underage 1731 when Thomas Crethers was chosen to be her guardian. Probably was the Elizabeth Lea who married Zachary Taylor (born 1707). Many printed accounts say Zachary Taylor's wife was Elizabeth, daughter of Hancock Lee, but location, time and family connections do not substantiate this.
  - (D) James Lea Underage 10/5/1731 when John Key was requested to be his guardian; Zachary Taylor entered as Surety, King and Queen Co., Va. To Caswell Co., N.C.

- III WILLIAM LEA - Born probably King and Queen Co., Va., 1710-1717. Underage 1731 when he, along with his sister, Betty, chose Thomas Crethers to be their guardian. He chose Zachary Taylor to be his guardian 10/5/1731 with Thomas Chew as Security, Of age 1737 when he entered suit and was chosen as juror. On 9/4/1744, William Lea and his wife, Rachel, sold a tract of land in St. George's Parish, Spotsylvania Co., Va. the same piece of land bought 6/6/1743 by William Lea "of Drysdale Parish, King and Queen Co., Va." On 3/18/1747, William Lea bought acerage Amelia Co., Va., lying on Buffalo Bed of Nottoway River. On 4/9/1750, William Lea and wife, Rachel, purchased adjoining land. In these Amelia Co., Va., purchases, William is again referred to as "of Drysdale Parish, King and Queen Co., Va. Will dated 6/18/1770 and probated 9/20/1770, Nottoway Parish, Amelia Co., Va. Rachel, whose name may have been Lewis or Ambrose, was living at the time of William's death. Issue:
  - (A) William Lee Will 8/1/1785 Amherst Co., Va. Married Susannah Dawson who married second, on 3/23/1787, Amherst Co., Va., William Dameron. William Lee and Susannah had: James Lee (married Ann Powell on 2/20/1792, daughter of Richard Powell), William Lee and a daughter.
  - (B) John Lee Will proved in Charlotte Co., Va., 1/6/1785. Evidently did not marry as estate left to brothers, sisters, niece and nephew.
  - (C) Milly Lee Married 2/23/1767 Thomas Dudley, Jr., of Amelia Co., Va. Married second by 1785 to an Elliott. (Note: There was a Thomas Dudley, Sr., and he is probably the Dudley who married, as her second husband, Ann Penn, widow of George Penn.
  - (D) Andrew Lee Married Elizabeth Dudley, daughter of Thomas Dudley, Sr. 11/23/1769, Amelia Co., Va. Witness: Jane Sneed and Thomas Dudley, Jr.
  - (E) Joseph Lee Born ca. 1744. Married Molly Knight, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Woodson) Knight of Brunswick Co., Va. To Chatham Co., N.C. 1787. Will Chatham Co., N.C. 1805.
  - (F) Lucy Lee Married Marston Green. Had daughter, Mary, who married James Harper, son of John Harper, on 2/27/1782, Amelia Co., Va.
  - (G) Elizabeth Lee Married Benjamin Clark (born 1730, died 1805) and son of John and Eliza Clark. Lived Lunnenburg Co., Va., and Wilkes Co., Ga.
  - (H) Mary Lee Married (1) Simeon Waldon and (2) George Penn, widower of her sister, Sarah.

Frances left will (Under Francis Tucker) dated 9/30/1808 and proved 1/1812, Patrick Co., Va. Frances (Penn) (Lee) Tucker had at least one son, Robert Tucker, by Drury Tucker. Issue of Ambrose Lee and Frances:
  - (a) Francis (Frank) Lee Will Parish Lexington, Amherst Co., Va., 12/1791. Wife Nancy, daughter of John Penn. They were married 11/1/1786, Amherst Co., Va. Issue: William and Sophia Lee.
  - (b) George Lee = Born 1750 and died 1825, Lincoln Co., Ky., where he removed 1791-2. He married, in Amherst Co., Va., on 1/21/1772, Elizabeth Shelton, daughter of Richard and Mary (Wright) Shelton. Issue:
    - (aa) Ambrose Lee Born 1/3/1773. Married Hannah Blain in 1801.
    - (bb) Pamelia Lee Born 11/27/1774. Married John Welsh.
    - (cc) Richard Henry Lee Married Martha Montgomery.
    - (dd) Mary Wright Lee Married Thomas Montgomery.
    - (ee) Lewis Lec Born 4/15/1781.
    - (ff) John Lee Born 1783, died Amherst Co., Va.

#### PENN

The parents of the brothers Moses, Joseph and George Penn are unknown. There was another Joseph Penn of Spotsylvania Co., Va., who deeded to John Taylor of Caroline Co., Va., 1763. He had wife, Elizabeth, and children: John, Philip, Moses, Thomas, Catherine (married Larkin Gatewood), Mary and Frances Penn. This Joseph Penn was undoubtedly closely related to the Penn brothers but the degree is unknown.

Moses Penn - Married 7/4/1739 to Catherine Taylor, daughter of John and Catherine (Pendleton) Taylor. Catherine Taylor born 12/30/1719, died 11/4/1774. Moses died 11/4/1759 in Caroline Co., Va., where he lived his life. They had only one son: John Penn, born 5/17/1741 and died 9/1788 in N.C. Married Susannah Lyne of Granville, N.C., 7/28/1763. Signer of the Declaration of Independence.

Joseph Penn - Married 2/3/1735 to Mary Taylor, daughter of John and Catherine (Pendleton) Taylor. Mary Taylor born 5/30/1718, died 9/14/1747. Joseph died ca. 1749. Issue: A child born 12/13/1736, Joseph (born 9/27/1738). Catherine (born 3/11/1741), Phillip (born 2/6/1742-3), Moses (born 12/3/1744), Elizabeth (born 1746), James (born 8/12/1748) and Thomas Penn (born 4/25/1740).

- GEORGE PENN Patented land in Spotsylvania Co., Va., adjoining Zachary Taylor. Of Drysdale Parish 9/28/1728. Lived Caroline Co., Va. Will destroyed but the record of its presentation to Court on 9/8/1749 by Ann Penn, wife of George Penn, exists. The will was again presented in Court by Moses Penn 2/1756. Division of estate in Caroline Co., Va., 12/14/1758. Division of property in Amherst Co., Va., "according to his will" made 11/12/1762. George owned land in Amherst Co., Va., where his family moved (after a stay in Amelia Co., Va.) following his death. George's widow, Ann, married second a Dudley (probably Thomas Dudley, Sr., and his children intermarried with siblings of Ann's son-in-law, Ambrose Lee). Ann then moved to Amherst Co., Va., where she left will dated 5/6/1794 and proved 7/21/1794. Issue of George and Ann:
  - 1. George Penn Born 12/13/1737, will 1796 Amherst Co., Va. Married (1) Sarah Lee and (2) Mary (Lee) Waldon (widow of Simeon Waldon). George's two wives were sisters and daughters of William and Rachel Lea of Amelia Co., Va. Issue: William, George, Wilson, Thomas, Moses, Lucy and Sally Penn. A Molly Harrison, Frances Burton and Nancy Savage were mentioned in George's will; possibly his daughters.
  - Phillip Penn Born 1/27/1739. Married Martha Crutcher, daughter of William Crutcher of Caroline Co., Va. Several children.
     One daughter, Sarah, married John Norton, Pittsylvania Co., Va., 7/26/1784. One son, Gabriel, married Charlotte Crutcher, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth (Lee) Crutcher, in Patrick Co., Va., 12/20/1794.

Late Note: The Natl.Cyc.of Amer.Bio., Vols.28 & 39, state parents of George Penn were John & Lucy (Granville) Penn. Parents of John Penn were William & Elizabeth (Markham) Penn (to colonies from England ca. 1657).

#### CRUTCHER

Crutcher, Critcher, Croucher, etc., means "dweller by the cross". This could mean one who lived by crossroads or the cross could refer to an agent of suffering. Tradition places this family from Wales but this is uncertain.

Below are brief outlines of several Crutcher groups. The relationship between these family groups is unknown except as indicated.

John Crutcher - Lived Old Rappanannock Co., Va., between 1677 and 1692 where three of his children were registered in the Farnham and North Farnham Parish. Married Jane Jadwin, daughter of John (?) and Anne (Montague (?)) Jadwin. John Crutcher deceased 1694. Jane married Edward Berry second and she was deceased by 1703 when son, John Crutcher, Jr., appeared in Westmoreland Co., Va., Court to settle estate. Issue (Perhaps other children):

Thomas Crutcher - Born 167?. Wife Margaret. Lived Middlessex Co., Va., 1713 when daughter, Margaret, was registered Parish Christ Church. In 1717 Thomas leased land in Essex Co., Va. His estate was handled by his son, Henry, in Essex Co., Va., 1722. Issue:

- Henry Crutcher Born 1700. Will 2/10/1778 5/15/1780, Essex Co., Va. Wife Catherine Cawthorn (?). Issue: Thomas, Henry, Jr., (he was witness to his uncle, Thomas Crutcher's will Caroline Co., Va., 1782), Reuben, Caty (Howerton), Sarah (Covington), Susanna (Cheaney), Margaret (Harper), and Richard Crutcher.
- 2. Thomas Crutcher Born 1706. Land K&Q and Caroline Cos., Va. Will 1/11/1782, died 6/1786, Parish Drysdale, Caroline Co., Va. Wife Sarah who lived to be over 95 and died 1801 Nelson Co., Ky. Leonard Crutcher - Deceased by 1773 K&Q Co., Court in Essex Co., Va.

William Crutcher - In Caroline Co., Va., 1734 with wife, Anne, and daughter, Priscilla, leased land from Alexander Spotswood.

Hugh Crutcher - Deceased Caroline Co., Va., 8/9/1781. Wife Betsy Norvell of Essex Co., Va. Issue: Patsey, James, Sukey, Hugh and John.

- WILLIAM CRUTCHER Of Caroline Co., Va. Wife Sarah? The parents of this William are unknown. It is possible he was son of the William Crutcher who was in Caroline Co., Va., 1734 with wife, Anne, and daughter, Priscilla. He was not a son of the Thomas Crutcher, born 1706. William was deceased by 1768 when his son, Samuel E. Crutcher, referred to himself as an orphan and apprenticed himself as a carpenter to Samuel Murphy in Amherst Co., Va. William's estate was still being settled in 1775, Amherst Co., Va. Issue:

Elizabeth Pollard born 1763 and died Williamson Co., Tenn., 1/14/1848. William died Williamson Co., Tenn., 12/13/1833; where they removed in 1823 from Amherst Co., Va. William's widow swore in 1846 that William had served six years in the Va. State Line in Revolutionary War. Her claim for a pension was rejected because, at that time, no record of a marriage could be found. Issue:

#### COLLINS

The Parents of James Collins are unknown. Family tales say his father was from Ireland; another that he was of French extraction. There is also disagreement on James Collins' first wife, Sarah Oglesby: some members of the family insist she was a Logan. There could be two marriages for Sarah or else family history became blurred — as it is prone to do— and possibly James Collins' mother was a Logan. All this is mere speculation and adds up to the fact that absolutely nothing is known of the forebears of James Collins or either of his two wives.

JAMES COLLINS - Born Ky. 11/26/1794, died Monroe Co., Mo., on 9/6/1853.
Married (1) probably in Ky. about 1818 to Sarah Oglesby. Sarah was born 1800, probably Ill., and died 12/25/1845 in Monroe Co., Mo. They homesteaded land in Monroe Co., Mo., on 11/15/1833. James married (2) Mahala (Leary) Doctor, the widow of John C. Doctor who died about 1837 in Ohio. The Doctors were early settlers of Ohio from Va. Mahala was born 1810 and died 3/10/1854, Monroe Co., Mo. She had at least three children by John C. Doctor: James H., John and Elizabeth Doctor. James Collins had 14 children in all; 12 by Sarah and 2 by Mahala. James Collins and both of his wives are buried on the property of Ethel Rubison, Route 4, Shelbina, Mo., near the State Right-of-Way on Route CC East of Route 15, Monroe Co., Mo. Issue:

#### **ROGERS**

The name Rogers or Roges is believed to be derived from the word Hruod in Frank; Hrother in the North; and Ruhm in Modern German - meaning fame or glory. Another meaning: One whose word is reliable. Still another claim is that the name is derived from French and the original of the name, Roger I, of Sicily and Calabria, was born in Normandy about 1031.

The maternal ancestry of John Rogers, the martyr, has been traced from English records from Charlemagne down through Edward I.

- I. JOHN ROGERS Born Deritend, England, in the Parish of Aston neir Birmingham, about 1500. Married Adriana de Weyden, an English girl, of Antwerp.

  Minister of the Gospel and the first martyr in Queen Mary's reign. Educated at University of Cambridge. He declined to conform to the Roman Catholic Faith, left England, and was chaplain in Brabant, Antwerp. He and his family settled in Wittenburg, Saxony. He returned to England on the accession of Edward VI but, when the Romanists resumed control under Bloody Mary, he was thrown into prison and condemned to death. A pardon was offered if he would recant but he refused. He was burned at the stake at Smithfield, England, 2/4/1555 for preaching heresy. His wife and children watched his death. Although there were nine or ten children, only the names of five of the children are known:
  - NOTE: One of Rev. John Rogers' sons (which??) and his wife died young. Their son, John Rogers (see III) was educated by his uncle, Rev. Richard Rogers.

#### WELLES

The family name of Welles, Wells, originated in the House of Vaux in the ancient Province of Neustria (later Normandy). As early as 794 this House occupied a prominent position in Europe. The earliest English record of the House of Vaux is that of Harold de Vaux, Lord of Vaux in Normandy, who came in England ca. 1120 with sons Hubert, Ranulf and Robert and settled in Co. Cumberland; the lake and valley region. The sons thereupon took the name of de Vallibus; meaning "from the valley". A descendent of the eldest son, Hubert de Vallibus, took the name of Robert de Welles in 1145 and his descendents bore the name as Lords de Welles of Rayne Hall, Co. Essex, England. A grandson of Robert de Welles, William de Welles, was holder of a Manor of Welles near Alford, Linconshire, shortly after 1194. Robert Welles of Stourton in Whichford was descended from the Linconshire Branch of the de Welles family.

#### TUTTLE

History records that four distinct families of the name of Tuttle, or a name resembling this form, came over to America as early as 1634. The name is supposed to have originated by families living near the natural or artificial mounds called tot-hills, which abound in widley separated localities in England. Another authority derives the name, at least in Scotland and Ireland, from O'Tuathail, anglicized Toole, Tuthill and Tuttle; the members of which family were Kings of Leinster, Princes of Imaile, and Chiefs of Hy-Mureadaigh or Hy-Murray, the surname being derived from the commander Tuathail.

A permanent seat of the family was in Devonshire, England. A family pedigree, bearing the date 1591, places at the head one William Totyl of Devonshire. It is probable that the immigrant Tuttles had a close connection with this family; especially the three Tuttle brothers Richard, John and William who arrived on the "Planter" on 4/1635 after a long and stormy voyage.
